

## FRANK J. GOODNOW AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

The Frank Johnson Goodnow Award was created by the American Political Science Association (APSA) Council in 1996 to honor service to the community of teachers, researchers, and public servants who daily toil in the many fields of politics. Frank J. Goodnow, the first president of the APSA, a pioneer in the development of judicial politics, and former president of Johns Hopkins University is an exemplar of the public service and volunteerism that this award represents.

Each year, APSA solicits nominations from members of the Council, former winners, and members of the Association. Nominations are then considered by the APSA Development Committee, who in turn select a slate of nominees to be approved by the APSA Administrative Committee. Award winners are recognized at the annual Awards Ceremony and Luncheon, held as part of the APSA Annual Meeting.
